Arts-based Learning Fund

The Arts-based Learning Fund supports work which enables pupils in formal education settings, particularly those experiencing systemic inequality or disadvantage, to thrive through engagement with high quality, arts-based learning.

Location: North West

Project: Co-creating positive communication strategies through drama-based learning

Description: Ariel Trust is an educational charity developing best practice in safeguarding education through communication and resistance skills via forum theatre techniques. This grant allows Ariels Trust to expand on their work empowering children to articulate their needs through rehearsing behaviours. The programme aims to extend the practice in 12 Liverpool schools, by securing forum theatre techniques not only with pupils but with teachers, schools and parents to change the way adults communicate with children about sex and relationships education.

Project: Adventures in Learning: Pathways

Description: KIT Theatre uses immersive theatre and game mechanics to deliver curriculum learning in primary schools and develop children's creative talent. This grant supports their plans to co-construct and deliver Pathways - a flexible, long-term programme of immersive theatre to support learning across the curriculum - in primary schools across Thurrock in Essex, building on local partnerships.

Description: MakeBelieve Arts is a theatre and education charity, offering programmes to develop the creative, communication and literacy skills of children through arts-based workshops in schools for children, teachers and parents. This grant supports MakeBelieve Arts to adapt and develop its practice to work with SEND specialist teachers and Early Years educators, supporting children in SEND schools.

Description: The Black Curriculum (TBC) is a social enterprise that aims to deliver black British history teaching and learning across the UK. They run virtual and in-person programmes to schools, young people and corporations to promote the importance of Black history and develop free and licensable resources for schools. This grant supports the scaling of their Springboard Programme which teaches Black British History through Music and Poetry, tackling issues of racial inequity in the school system.

Trinity Community Arts will work in close partnership with other local arts and cultural organisations and the schools' staff.

Description: Arts Connect run programmes of arts and creative learning, professional development for teachers and the cultural sector with a focus on the Black Country. This grant supports Arts Connect to bring together three West Midland art galleries to work with teachers across nine primary schools on a two-year project developing oracy for pupils through contemporary art. Inspired by artists and collectives teachers will explore social issues, introduce new practices and take risks to be bold.

Description: Who Are We? Is an oracy project bringing together poet educators and spoken-word artists from Eastside Educational Trust, a leading youth arts charity, and teachers from six primary schools in East London and Essex. Celebrating pupils' diversity and identity through an exploration of language, Teachers work alongside inspirational artist practitioners developing poetry skills and spoken work as well as exploring their agency as creatives in their own right.

Dance Collective CIC

Project: Embedding Dance and Creative Movement in the Curriculum for Wales

Description: Dance Collective CIC is a collective of professional dance artists working across North Wales to deliver bespoke performance, education and community projects for the benefit of the communities of North Wales. This grant supports Dance Collective to develop a programme of professional development for teachers at nine schools in Llandudno, North Wales. Through collaboration with dance artists, teachers will develop their confidence, skills and knowledge in teaching dance and creative movement. The project also aims to support schools to develop strategies for embedding dance and creative movement throughout the Curriculum for Wales.

Project: Developing social, emotional and learning skills through drama and film

Description: Eden Court Highlands is the main cultural venue in the north of Scotland providing a dispersed, predominantly rural population with a diverse arts programme of live performance, independent cinema and creative engagement reaching local communities and schools across the region. This grant supports their work with ten rural primary schools in the Highland region of Scotland. Specialist artist practitioners will work collaboratively with teachers to develop arts-based approaches in their health, wellbeing and social studies teaching.

Description: Letchworth Garden City Heritage Foundation is a place-based Community Benefit Society with aims to make the world's first Garden City a great place to live. This grant supports the introduction of a Teacher/Artist-Practitioner Exchange Programme at Letchworth Garden City Heritage Foundation's Broadway Gallery. Taking place over two years of activity, the Teacher/Artist-Practitioner Exchange Programme is a fully collaborative continuous professional development project co-created with eight different primary schools in Letchworth.

This grant enables Polka Children’s Theatre to partner with six London primary schools, supporting Key Stage One teachers to strengthen pupils’ oracy, through drama and storytelling.

Description: Severn Arts is a charitable arts company bringing inclusive music and arts to people across Worcestershire. They widen access to the arts for all, particularly children and young people. This grant supports *Sing, Speak and Shine* within eight schools in higher need areas in the Rivers Multi Academy Trust, upskilling teachers to improve pupil oracy with non-traditional tools.

Project: Migrants Organise and British Palestinian Committee Partnership

Description: The British Palestinian Committee are an independent organisation with experience in a range of professional fields including policy, advocacy, human rights, law, academia, journalism, arts and culture. They work primarily in the policy advocacy arena to ensure that Palestinian experience and expertise are integral to British policy-making towards Palestine and Palestinians in the UK. This grant supports a joint project between the British Palestinian Committee and Migrants Organise, providing resources for a bilingual caseworker to support Palestinians immediately and help develop the community’s longer-term capacity to respond to Palestinians’ needs in the UK.

Description: Community Policy Forum seeks to promote evidence-based and community-centred approaches to policymaking surrounding the structural inequalities that face Muslim communities in the UK. This grant will fund additional staffing which will allow them to dedicate more resource to the migration arm of their work, and prioritise long-term projects over reactionary work, laying the foundations for long-lasting social change. Community Policy Forum's Islamophobia and Human Rights within the UK Asylum System project will be part of this work.

Description: European Philanthropic Initiative for Migration (EPIM) is Europe's largest and longest standing philanthropic collaborative working on issues of migration and inclusion. They fund and nurture alliances and partnerships, curate the migration ecosystem and cultivate a shared narrative for belonging and democratic resilience. Following a period of review and learning, EPIM has streamlined their thematic priorities and interventions. This grant will support EPIM to implement their new approach and pathway to change.

Description: Gaza Families Reunited are a campaigning group calling on the UK Government to urgently create a Gaza Family Scheme for Palestinians from Gaza to reunite with loved ones in the UK. This grant supports core costs to enable Gaza Families Reunited to continue to build public awareness, petition MPs and partner with groups and organisations to widen impact.

Project: Increasing opportunity through staff recruitment

Description: Kanlungan Filipino Consortium (Kanlungan) is a registered charity consisting of several Filipino community organisations working together for the welfare and interests of the Filipino and other migrant communities in Britain. Their work is focused on the promotion and protection of migrant rights and welfare by providing mental health and wellbeing support, skills training, immigration and employment advice, campaigns, and advocacy. This grant will support recruitment of additional staff, affording Kanlungan more opportunities to communicate and work effectively with statutory bodies, and share their insights into the East and Southeast Asian community.

Project: Building knowledge, radical solidarity and power for migration justice

Description: Right to Remain (formerly known as the National Coalition of Anti-Deportation Campaigns) is a human rights membership organisation which works with groups across the UK to promote and defend the rights of people seeking the right to remain in the UK. This grant supports the implementation of their new strategy and Theory of Change, made up of three interconnected stages: building knowledge, radical solidarity and power.

Description: Social Change Initiative (SCI) provide practical support, services and strategic advice to maximise the impact of donor funding for change, working to provide a bridge between the worlds of activism and philanthropy. This grant supports SCI to bring together a panel of Black activist leaders to oversee the design and implementation of their leadership programme and the selection of participants. The programme includes residential sessions, one-to-one mentoring (from Black mentors) and the opportunity of a mini-Fellowship for both self-development and issue exploration purposes.

Description: The Social Equity Centre is a not-for-profit expert consultancy provider that aims to narrow the gap for under-represented voices and build a more equal society where everyone feels heard and included. This grant provides core funding, increasing their capacity to keep abreast with changes such as immigration system and local government policy. It will also support The Social Equity Centre to explore and research the need for representation in the public sector for marginalised groups, and develop practical solutions and interventions to ensure that gaps are filled.

This grant provides staffing costs to enable SEEAC to strengthen their organisational infrastructure and ensure that day-to-day activities are safeguarded, compliant, and sustainable. Increased staffing will allow the Executive Director and Programme Manager to work strategically to develop and deliver sustainable programmes, campaigns, advocacy, and partnership building so that SEEAC can make more impact.

The Class Work Project will conduct the research and outreach needed to develop a new, updated version of the workshop to account for the experiences of migrant working-class people, and begin its delivery both to the relevant organisations and to the public.

Description: Article 39 fights for the rights of children and young people across England who live in institutional settings or have care experience. This grant will enable Article 39's children and young people's activism lead to support young people to use their direct experiences and knowledge of mental health inpatient care to press for reform of the Mental Health Act 1983. Funding will also enable Article 39 to develop a new membership scheme providing young people with training and support to share their stories with the media to influence public attitudes and government policy.
